### 58th Old Dominion Meet May 5 to 7, Lynchburg, VA

This year the ODMA Meet is officially an AACA recognized meet. ODMA was awarded its "Certificate of Charter" by AACA as a non-geographical region at the AACA Annual Meeting in Philly on Feb. 10, 2011. Ken Talley, Sandy Hall, Tom Cox, and Terry Bond were to primary movers to make this happen.

The 58th meet was held in Lynchburg, known as the Hill City. Kathy Kellam was the meet chairperson and had asked for help from her fellow members of TRAACA for some of the jobs for the meet. Richard and Sandy Hall did registration and Neil Sugermeyer served as chief judge. Lynchburg member Michael Sperrazza served as field marshal and other Lynchburg members managed the tour to Appomattox, hospitality room, silent auction, program, banquet, and other jobs. The Lynchburg Region is doing the steps TRAACA did a few years ago in hosting ODMA before taking on an AACA national meet.



The tour to Appomattox was held on Friday, and mile by mile instructions were in the excellent program provided to each person who registered a car. The folks who attended came back with rave reviews.



The ODMA meet turned out well, and Lynchburg Region is to be congratulated for the job they did in hosting the event. There are always a few bumps in the road, but everything worked out smoothly in the end, and we had a fine time renewing friendships from other clubs around the state. Richard and Sandy Hall did a great job of handling the registration for ODMA, and I got my feet wet as a chief judge. It wasn't as hard as I had imagined, but I still made a few mistakes that can easily be remedied in the future. Still, It's not the same as being a field judge.

Stowe, Vermont was a delightful surprise from the moment we checked in to our accommodations. We had experienced two rough days of rain and wind on the way up, and the forecast for show day wasn't promising, nor was weather for the other activities planned for the day prior. Sue Bond and Marty went on a tour to the granite quarry in Barre, and Terry and I tried to find a few antique shops in the Stowe and Waterbury area on Friday, but we didn't find anything of interest in them and returned during a shower to the suite we all shared to relax before the barbecue dinner. Our suite was without question the best I have ever stayed in for any AACA event. We each had separate bedrooms and baths, with a common sitting room, a balcony, TV in every room, a complete kitchen with all the necessary dishes, silverware and cooking utensils, a washer and dryer, and a gas fireplace. The Stowe Mountain Lodge is at the base of the ski runs, so in winter, the lifts are only a walk away. There were still a few patches of snow to be seen on the nearby slopes, but by this time, the indoor/outdoor heated pool was open. The place was even pet friendly, so our dog Johnny got to go on the trip.

Show day started off with a shower, but by 9 AM the rain stopped, and it dried off for the remainder of the show until an-

other shower quickly closed things out about 15 minutes before the scheduled end. About 250 cars were present, including some from Canada, which is less than 200 miles from Stowe. We had a good Tidewater turnout, with Pellerins showing their 1937 Volvo, Roughtons showing their 1909 International, and Lockes showing their 1977 Demm-Smily moped. In addition, Dan Ciccone and Tony Scarpelli, Kathy Kellam and Tom Cox and Marty and I made the trip. Green Mountain Region, the hosts, are a small group of only 12, but got some able assistance from the Vermont Auto Enthusiasts, Pat and Nelson Thorpe, Dave Zimmerman, and of course AACA directors to make things happen. The meet was one of the most enjoyable I've attended, and it showed what a motivated and dedicated group can accomplish. Congratulations to GMR President Gene Napoliello and meet Chairman Dick Pignatello for a great event!

We extended our trip home to take in a few more antique shops, make a quick stop by our summer camp on Lake Dunmore which was not yet opened up, spent a day seeing the homes where I grew up and what was left of my grandfathers' farm in New Jersey, and stopped for lunch at a Starbucks in Bronxville, N.Y. that had once been an Amoco gas station where I worked as a teenager. The surprise, however, was when we returned home to find the results of the storm that had passed through Tidewater an hour or so earlier. Branches from the tree on our front yard were all over the lawn and in the street, and our power was off for the next two days. But we had the memories of a super trip to the heart of Vermont.





We'll gather in the Greenbrier Sears parking lot at 8 am, and roll out at 8:15. The planned route is to take I-64 to I-664 and the Monitor Merrimac tunnel, picking up I-64 to I-295 and on to the Raceway. We'll maintain a steady pace determined by the request of the oldest car's driver, and maintain it via GPS tracking (No trusting speedometers!).
