Founder's Inn, Virginia Beach May 19—21, 2022

AACA's 2022 Grand Nationals kicked off with a bus tour to visit Dwight and Jane Schaubach's private automobile collection in Carroltown and Smithfield, with a lunch stop at the famous Smithfield Station. The Schaubach's had beautiful classic vehicles and ongoing restoration projects on display, with restoration staff on hand to talk to visitors and answer questions. After dinner entertainment was an Ice Cream Social in the formal gardens at Founders Inn with waffle cones made on the very first ice cream cone machine by Norfolk's famous Doumar's BBQ. (Abe Doumar created & sold the first waffle cones on the same machine at the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis, MO.) More than 100 TRAACA folks volunteered to assist with the show, and a lot more than that worked as judges or brought vehicles!

2022 Zenith Award Winner



1929 Du Pont Model G

Hershey, Pennsylvania, May 25, 2022 – The Antique Automobile Club of America (AACA) has selected a 1929 Du Pont for its 2022 Zenith Award winner. Owned by Lammot J. du Pont of McLean, Virginia, this automobile is one of only 25 Model G Club Sedans ever built and is one of only a handful of Du Pont automobiles known to exist today.

Under its hand-crafted body by the Merrimac Body Company, the limited production Du Pont was well known for its superb engineering, outstanding performance and distinctive styling. Power is provided by a 322-cubic-inch Continental inline-eight engine producing 125 horsepower.

This particular Du Pont started out as a total basket case that was little more than a parts car. After several years of research and meticulous craftsmanship by its talented restorers, it rightfully earned the AACA's coveted Zenith Award for 2022.

This prestigious award recognizes the very best automobile restoration for its overall quality, authenticity and rarity. The 13 automobiles that competed for this year's Zenith Award, held at the AACA Grand Nationals in Virginia Beach, Virginia, May 20-21, 2022, were selected from each of the AACA National shows in 2021. Only one vehicle can be crowned "Restoration of the Year," and this stunningly restored 1929 Du Pont clearly deserved that honor.

"Despite tough competition from each of the vehicles nominated, the Du Pont exemplified the Zenith Award as the finest restoration of the year and will wear that title well. The competing cars and owners were first-class – a real testament to the fine spirit of the hobby," stated Tom Cox, AACA Board VP and the founder of the Zenith program.

Congratulations also goes to the runner-up, a 1928 Auburn Boattail Speedster owned by Richard and Helen Harding of Beavercreek, Ohio.

It's Not the Mileage

In December I purchased a 1977 Cadillac with 52,000 miles from an AACA member in Hampton, VA and drove it 647 miles to my home in Louisville, KY. Having no issues on that trip, we decided to drive it on the 2022 Founders Tour in Mobile, AL.

All was well until we were about 30 miles north of Mobile on I-65 and the engine died and we coasted over to the emergency lane. I opened the hood and not seeing anything unusual got back in, turned the key, and it started up. The next exit was only about ¼ mile, so we pulled into a gas station. The gas gauge was showing a ¼ tank, so I filled up. The car never died again. Now I know that ¼ tank really means “empty.”

The second day of the tour, we pulled into our first stop and as I turned into the parking lot, I heard the power steering pump whining. One of the locals said there was a hardware store, grocery store, and a Dollar General store just down the road. All three stores were out of power steering fluid so, I called one of the Deep South region members. Darrin brought me a bottle of power steering fluid. I Filled the reservoir, started the car, and there was a high-pressure leak in the hose when I turned the steering wheel. As most real men know, duct tape can fix anything, so we wrapped the line so that it wasn't spraying everywhere when we loaded it onto Darrin's trailer. We hauled the car to Darrin's shop about five miles away and luckily, the auto parts store had a power steering hose in stock. Normally, this would have been a ten-minute job, but the open-end wrench couldn't break the fittings loose, so we had to cut the line at both ends and use a 6-point socket with a breaker bar to break the fittings loose.

I learned several things from this adventure. Get to know all the little idiosyncrasies of your car, especially one you have just purchased. Even though you have a very low mileage car, some items like belts and hoses are subject to age rather than mileage so keep spares with you on a long trip. You can always depend on AACA members to come to the rescue.






